PREFACE TO THE READER.

THIS Reader contains nearly 1500 different words. The lessons are graded as slowly, as the limited space, and introduction of as many new words as possible, would allow. The lessons are on a variety of subjects, and include a great many sentences used in ordinary conversation. Gospel truths have been introduced as far as practicable. The Chinese portion is in the Canton dialect, which is the spoken language of the Chinese in America, Australia, and the Sandwich Islands. The object of using this dialect, instead of the more elegant style of their language, is to give the learner the meaning of the English in plain and simple words, such as he himself would use in expressing the same thing.

tions. It turns round on its ax-is, from west to east, once ev-er-y twen-ty four hours. It al-so goes round the sun once ev-er-y year.

3. The earth turning on its ax-is causes day and night. The sun shines on one half of the earth at a time. The side which is toward the sun has day, and the op-po-site side has night.

4. If the earth did not turn round, the side next to the sun would have day all the time, and the op-po-site side night all the time. But, as it turns, ev-er-y part has day and night by turns.

5. It is a-bout twen-ty five thou-sand miles a-round the world, and eight thou-sand miles through the cen-tre


